The 2013 entry fees are listed below and you will see that there has been only one increase in the fees: Junior Primary individual items are now R15 per item, the same as those for Senior Primary. The fees for Group items remain as they were last year. Our Admin Fee is based on the total amount of your entry fees, so please use the sliding scale on your Remittance Form to calculate the amount to pay, and remember to include it in your initial payment.

As always we recommend that you take advantage of our workshop offers to assist you in your preparations for the festival. Each workshop is tailored to the specific needs
of the school concerned and will be held at times that suit you. Use your booking form to book your workshop or phone me to find out more about them.

MONOLOGUE COMPETITION

The Monologue Competition was introduced in 2003 to honour Bruce Piper who, as many will remember, served as Chairman of the Speech and Drama Association for 21 years.

To be eligible to enter the competition, which is open to high school pupils only, a candidate has to have been awarded an A+ symbol for a monologue during that year's festival, and then be nominated by the adjudicator.
