## **OBSERVATIONS OF A LEARNER SPEECH AND DRAMA TEACHER**

am a qualified ballet teacher with over 30 years experience. My mother was an English teacher and librarian so I grew up with an interest in words and spoken language, and studied speech and drama until I left school.

When I was asked to coach trainee ballet teachers in voice projection and pronunciation, and realised I didn't have any notes to work from, I contacted Vyvienne Ball at the Speech and Drama Association to ask her to put me in touch with someone with whom I could take lessons. I am now working on the three year Licentiate Course (Speech and Drama College of SA) with Zelda van den Berg, and so enjoying learning how to 'speak proper' again. Zelda is a wonderfully encouraging and inspiring teacher and I have also had a lot of useful advice and support from Dawn Haynes. I think speech and drama teachers are really nice people!

I have been adjudicating speech and drama festivals for over a year now and this has been a very rewarding experience for me and has redoubled my desire to teach speech and drama. It has been interesting to note the differences in confidence between boys and girls and privileged and under-privileged. Children who have experienced speech and drama lessons show a definite advantage. I have adjudicated a few pre-primary schools where there were children with speech impediments. You would never have thought so as they were enthusiastic, lively and spontaneous. They were having fun - all due to the confidence inspired in them by their speech and drama teacher.

Notwithstanding the advantages for children in knowing that they can communicate well, wouldn't it be tremendous to have television and radio announcers, reporters and anchormen, speaking clearly and fluently?

I wish I had started studying speech and drama seriously a long time ago. It would have made such a difference to my approach to teaching ballet. Reading *Development Through Drama* by Brian Way and *Child Play (its importance for human development)* by Peter Slade, has brought home to me how essential Drama in Education (D.I.E.) is and how crucial it is to build confidence in children as well as adults.

Let us all try to nurture a generation of children and young adults by encouragement, confidencebuilding and understanding. It doesn't matter who we are - we all need ego-boosting. Why else do we go on stage? It's for that great feeling you get when you hear the audience clapping and cheering - the feeling that tells you, "They like me, they really like me!"
